## LANDING SURVEYS

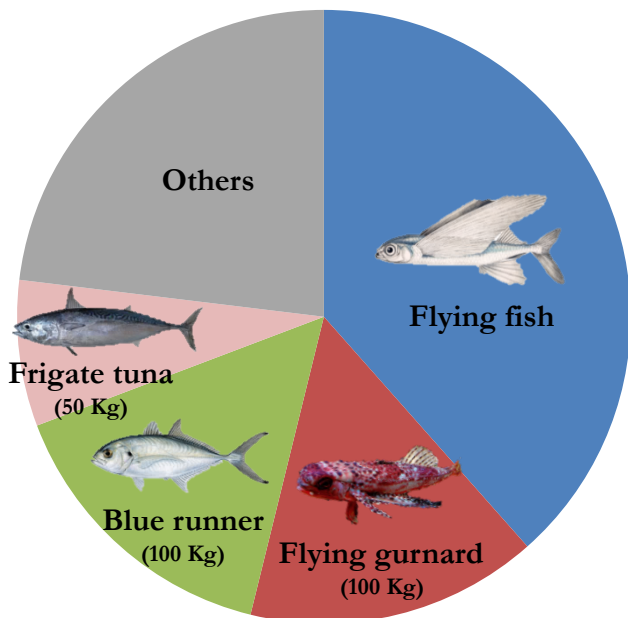
Since December 2016, Omali Vida Nón’s team has been conducting fisheries landing surveys in the six communities of the project, including Praia Burras. These data allow us to know and understand better Príncipe’s artisanal fishery. In this sheet, data from December to May have been summarised.

### Fishing trips

On average, 20 fishing trips happen every week.

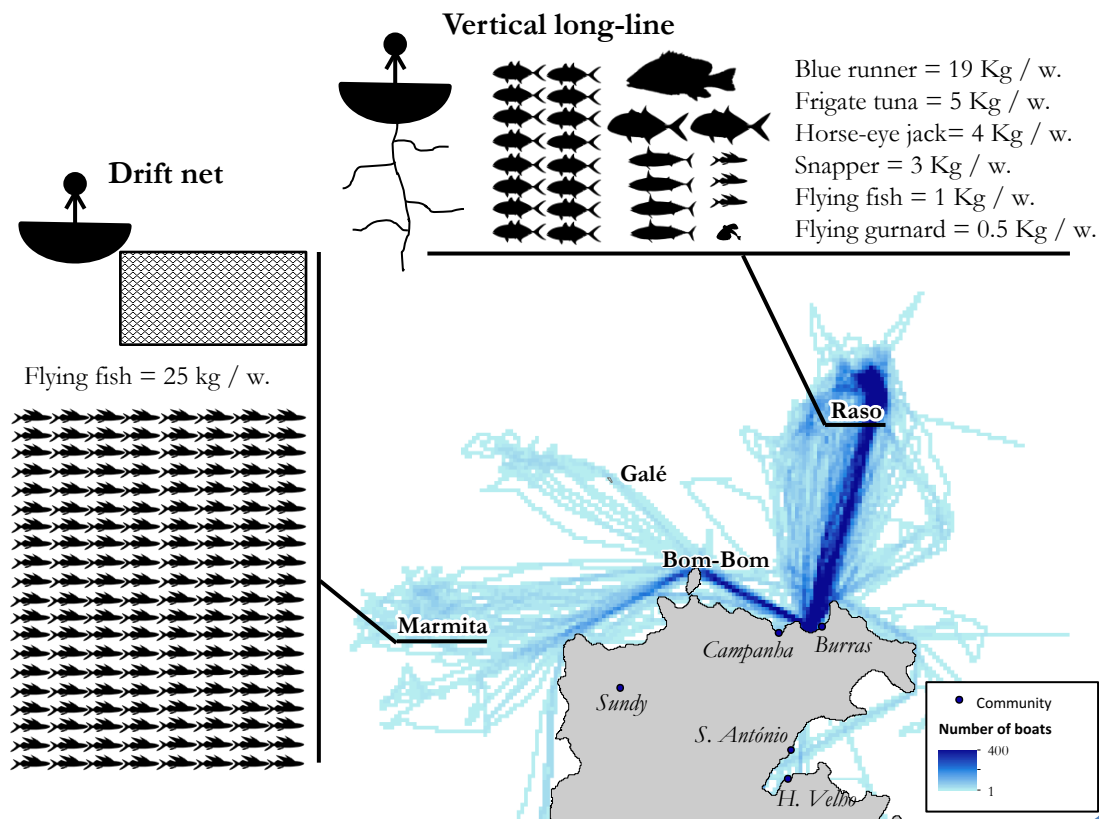
### Total catch

650 kg of fish are caught in Praia Burras every week.



### Catch by fishing gear and ground

The most frequented fishing grounds by Praia Burras fishers are Raso and Marmita. The most used fishing gears by fishers in Praia Burras are the drift net and vertical long-line. The most used fishing gear in Raso is the vertical long-line and the drift net in Marmita.
